COMMUNION PRAYER


The congregation stands.

PRAYER OF CONSECRATION

The minister says:

Come, Holy Spirit, come. Bless this bread, and bless this fruit of the vine. Bless all of us in our eating and drinking at this table, that our eyes may be opened and that we may recognize the risen Christ in our midst.

THE LORD'S PRAYER

In unison:

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name. Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done, on earth, as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.

THE GIFT OF THE BREAD AND CUP

We break this bread to share in the body of Christ. Though we are many, we are one body, because we all share in one bread. The gifts of God for the people of God:

The body of Christ, the bread of life. The blood of Christ, the cup of salvation.

THE PRAYER OF THANKSGIVING


Minister:Let us pray:As the silence of the night envelops us, O God, we give thanks for the love
